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# NOTABLE PROJECTS



## BLUMENAUER BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

The Congressman Earl Blumenauer Bicycle and Pedestrian Bridge is under construction and scheduled to open in 2022. The culmination of a 30-year vision to strengthen connections between Lloyd and the Central Eastside, the bridge will provide a dedicated route across I-84 for people walking and biking, and be a vital link in the future Green Loop.

## GARBAGE CANS

Our Public Place Garbage Can Program saw the addition of 20 new cans in 2020. Senior students from Benson High School's Digital Media Arts Program produced art for the cans' exterior, earning work experience and money while helping to beautify the neighborhood. In 2021, Go Lloyd will continue its partnership with Benson and install an additional 12 cans, each featuring an original work of art.

## BICYCLE INFRASTRUCTURE

Our Bicycle Parking Program helps businesses and properties offer short- and long-term bike parking to employees, residents, and visitors, improving access to jobs, homes, and destinations. We partnered with Colliers International to fund and design a bike cage at the 1201 Lloyd Building that can store 40 bikes; other projects included parking for 22 bikes at SEIU's new headquarters in Lloyd.

## SPEED READER BOARDS

Keeping our roadways safe for all users is of paramount importance to Go Lloyd. Last year we purchased two speed reader boards and donated them to PBOT for exclusive use in the Lloyd neighborhood. Installed on NE Halsey Street, on the north side of Lloyd Center, these boards have already had a noticeable impact on driver behavior.

## DUCKWORTH DOCK SWIM LADDERS



Go Lloyd supported the Human Access Project's work to create a world-class public swimming location on the Willamette River, providing funds for eight swim ladders at Duckworth Dock. We'll continue this partnership in 2021 by adding bike racks with enough space to park 20 bikes at the dock.
